Know all men by these presents that I, Berthier Warren of the Town of Holden and County of Worcester, Commonwealth of Massachusetts, in consideration of One Dollar & other considerations paid by Ann E. Williams and Susan E. Warren of said Holden the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the Ann E. Williams and Susan E. Warren their heirs and assigns the following tract of land situated in the Centre of Holden on the road leading from near the entrance to Grove Cemetery to the freight depot on the Worcester Branch of the Fitchburg Rail road and bounded as follows, viz: Commencing at the Northeast corner of land belonging to W. G. Warren's Sons, on the line of road first above-named and running in a North-easterly direction forty (40) feet more or less to an iron pipe driven in the ground at corner of land of grantees, thence in a Northwesterly direction one hundred and forty feet (140 ft.) more or less along the line of land of grantees to an iron stake driven in the ground on line of land of W. G. Warren's Sons — thence in a Southeastely direction forty feet (40 feet) along line of land of said W. G. Warren's Sons
