

I, Albert E. Blain, otherwise known as Albert E. Blaine

of Mendon, Worcester County, Massachusetts, being unmarried, for consideration paid, grant to myself, the said Albert E. Blain and my wife, Theresa Blain, as joint tenants, both of said Mendon with warranty covenants

the land in said Mendon, with the buildings thereon, situated on the southerly side of West Hill Road, so-called, and bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at the northwesterly corner of a lot belonging to the heirs of Stephen Wood, now or formerly, on the southerly side of said Road; thence with the southerly side of said road S. 87 1/5° W. 18 rods; thence S. 86 1/5° W. 7 rods and 18 links; thence S. 75 3/5° W. 15 rods and 20 links; thence still continuing by the southerly side of said road S. 73° W. 33 rods and 5 links to land now or formerly of Joseph Miller; thence by land of said Miller S. 39 1/5° E. 21 rods and 20 links; thence S. 53° E. 6 rods; thence S. 2 1/5° W. 5 rods to a white oak tree on the westerly side of the saw-mill road; thence S. 33 3/4° E. 17 rods and 7 links; thence still continuing by the westerly side of said road, and easterly of and adjoining land of said Miller, S. 43 1/2° E. 17 rods to a stake and stones at land now or formerly of George and Ellis Taft; thence by said Taft land N. 89 5/12° E. 30 rods to a stake and stones at land now or formerly of Leonard Taft; thence by land of said Leonard Taft and land belonging to the heirs of Stephen Wood N. 2 1/2° E. 67 1/2 rods to the first mentioned bound or corner at the road. Containing 21 acres and 65 square rods, more or less.


